

Hugh Turrall

Cinematography Bio (2010-2018)

Hugh is a cinematographer and camera operator, working in **drama** and **documentary** film and TV. An independent science fiction thriller, "Restoration" (<http://restorationfilm.com/>), directed by Stuart Willis, which he shot in 2014/5, won Best Cinematography at New York Webfest in 2017. Restoration had its premiere screening on Channel 9 Go in 2016 and streamed on STAN from September 8, 2016 to February 2018 and is distributed internationally by the French company Rockzeline. Restoration is currently lying 7th in the Web Series World Cup 2018 and has more than 20 wins in different categories in international film/web festivals. Hugh also has distribution credits on the ABC series "Housemates" (seasons 1 and 2) as a cinematographer.

Before working in film, Hugh worked as a water resources engineer in many places around the world, and lived long term in Botswana, Nepal (2y), Pakistan (Baluchistan, 3y), Indonesia (3y), Vietnam (~2.5y) and Sri Lanka (6y). He is used to living and working in "tough conditions" if required. He has visited China many times since 1994, working with the Chinese Academy of Sciences, Yellow River Commission, provincial and national water agencies and various Universities.

- I have mostly graded the material I have shot (using Da Vinci Resolve), although we had a proper professional grader for "Restoration" (thanks Adrian Hauser at Cutting Edge) and "Housemates". I have been grading occasionally on a commercial basis.
- An engineering background is helpful in problem solving, on and off- set. I can do a variety of machining and fabrication tasks (lathe and milling machine operation etc.) to make equipment for particular cinematography needs. Items I have made and use include: a 6m portable crane with remote head; a jib for operating off dollies; long offset arm for dollies; a vertical slider; helmet cam; focus gears for vintage lenses; wally dolly; product ("Dayna") dolly; floor "foot" dolly, bungee rigs and anti-vibration mounts for gimbal stabilisers.
- My company, Roving Picture Films Pty Limited, has a selection of camera, lighting and grip gear – including RED Scarlet Dragon Camera, Aaton XTR S16 film camera and sets of vintage and modern prime lenses (Baltar, Schneider-Kreuznach, and Red Pro Primes; 16mm Zeiss Superspeeds and Kowa Ultra Speeds)), and 2 Cooke Zoom lenses. We have a JVC GY LS 300 4k camera for current documentary use – using Nikon primes and zooms.
- In 2009, I was fortunate to get a place on the Camera Assistant Training Scheme at the Australian Film, TV and Radio School (AFTRS) in Sydney, and worked as 1 and 2 AC on 9 short films and a feature film to celebrate the 50th anniversary of NIDA. Prior to that, I attended the Melbourne Uni Film Summer School in 2016 to test the water.

I am available for B-cam, second unit, or other operating work (hand-held, fluid head, geared head, hot head, gimbal stabiliser (Ronin/Movi) on TV drama or feature films and any opportunities as a DoP. For me, story is 'king' and my intention is above all to serve story and performance. I like to set a 'look' in-camera (digital cinema) and like to use filters and appropriate lighting to that end. I prefer the "classic" cinematic movement of dollies, cranes and jibs, but have done a lot of hand-held work recently and some work with gimbal stabilisers. I like naturalistic lighting.

- I am comfortable shooting in a variety of formats including 35 and 16mm film and any of the current high-end digital cameras (RED, ARRI, Sony).
- I have some capability as a steady cam operator and completed a steady cam course with Harry Panagiotidis in Melbourne in February 2018.

I am also interested in documentary work as a cinematographer/cameraman and am keen to work on overseas assignments as well as those in Australia. I am particularly interested in documentary assignments in Africa.

- For documentary work I have used Sony F5, Red Scarlet/Epic, Canon C300 Mk 1 and 2, JVC GY LS 300, and older cameras – Sony EX1/EX3, JVC HD111, and DSLRs.

- I have a small drone (Mavic Pro) for documentary work – and have a CASA ARN for commercial use.
